Evangelical Homiletics Society Announces Sermon Competition Scholarship and PhD Scholars Grant

WACO, Texas (November 12, 2018) — The Evangelical Homiletics Society (EHS) provides two significant awards yearly. The Haddon W. Robinson Preaching Award competition is open to all Associate Members of EHS, specifically for master of divinity students. Sermons are to be 15 to 20 minutes in length, focusing on a New Testament Parable. The sermons are judged by a panel of veteran EHS members. The first-place sermon will be published in *The Journal of the Evangelical Homiletics Society*. The deadline for the scholarship is April 30, 2019. The Scott M. Gibson Emerging Scholars Grant is open to all Associate Members of EHS who are enrolled in a PhD program studying preaching. Essays of 15,000 to 20,000 words are to focus on research regarding a relevant issue in homiletics. A committee of homiletics professors will assess the essays and determine a recipient. The awardee is expected to attend the annual EHS meeting. He or she will receive a grant of \$2,000, have their essay published in *The Journal of the Evangelical Homiletics Society*, and will have one's registration fees and meals for the annual conference covered by EHS.
